On Tuesday, we were pleased to hold a STEM day in school. During this day, we collapsed our normal curriculum and the children enjoyed taking part in activities within their classes that supported Science, Technology, English and Maths. As part of this STEM day, the children in classes 3 & 4 were asked to think like engineers and invent a new piece of equipment with a purpose and the children in classes 1 & 2 enjoyed an egg rolling challenge.

Over the last two evenings, we have held our open evenings for parents. These are an important opportunity for you to celebrate your child's progress and discuss the ways in which we can work together to support your child. These were very well attended and I am grateful to all of the parents who took the time to complete one of our questionnaires. During the evening, I was asked by a number of parents about books for sale. In the past, we have only held our book fair at our autumn parents' evening. We are happy though to arrange a further book fair at our spring open evenings if there is a demand for this.

Today, the children in Class 3 performed their class worship for parents. This showcased the children's learning across a range of subjects and included two songs that were performed brilliantly. Well done to Miss Hodgson and all of the children for such an enjoyable performance.

Next Thursday (7th March) is World Book Day. During this day, the children will spend some time taking part in some special activities that promote the love of reading. We will be allowing the children to come to school in non school uniform and to dress as a book character should they wish to. There is, however, no expectation to go out and buy a costume if you don't already have one!

Next week we are looking forward to writing a report about a mystery.


Class 4 This week we enjoyed listening to an engineer from Ford on our STEM day.

to be part of a winning team!


