Thank you to everyone for your generous donations on Tuesday for our Harvest Festival. We celebrated this at All Saints Church and it was wonderful to see the church so full of family and friends. The service was led by the children and each class performed a song or poem. We were pleased to share this service with North Cave Preschool and also a group of deaf children from the Resource Base at Christopher Pickering Primary School. Our harvest celebrations have continued today with a themed afternoon today in which all of the children have taken part in activities in their four house groups.

This year our sports provision is being led by Miss McDonald and on Tuesday, we were pleased to see our first interschool competition of this academic year. Accompanied by Miss McDonald and Mrs Holmes, a group of children from Years 5 and 6 took part in some interschool football against other local schools. The children played well and were a credit to our school. Unfortunately, the cross-country competition was postponed last week and the rearranged date clashes with our parents evening so we will be unable to attend.

This term, we have been pleased to launch a running club each Friday and this has proved popular. Last week, we added to this a football club on a Monday lunchtime and this will now take place for both boys and girls in Class 3 and Class 4 each week. We intend to launch a similar lunchtime club for the children in Class 1 and Class 2 later this term. In addition to sports, next week, Miss Cawood will be relaunching the Jesus and Me (JAM) club and we will ensure that the children in school know how to become involved.

We are proud of the way in which music enriches our curriculum and the way in which we are able to offer a range of musical instrument tuition within school time from external tutors. This week, we have been pleased to take delivery of 15 ukuleles which we have on loan until Christmas. This means that in addition to the whole year group strings lesson for the children in Year 4, the children in Year 3 will also have a taste of learning a tuned instrument.

Yesterday Mrs Bamford introduced World Space Week and we held a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) day in school to celebrate. All of the classes had the opportunity of taking part in some collaborative activities. Within Class 1 and Class 2, the children designed and made nests whilst in Class 3, the children filtered water to look for microplastic. In Class 4, the children designed and made a house that could live on the moon. We are grateful to Mrs Pearson who joined us at the end of the day to share her experiences of being an ENT consultant.

This week, Mrs Holmes has met with Year 6 parents and next week we will be holding our parent consultations for the rest of the school. During these evenings, we will once again be hosting a Scholastic book fair which is a good opportunity to purchase some quality children's books. The school earns commission from each sale and this helps us to restock the books available for our children. Appointment slips have been sent to parents.
