

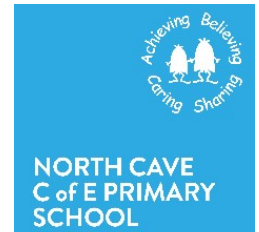

Dear Parents,

Thank you for your patience and understanding this week as we have experienced difficulties in our kitchen. This has been linked to the drainage in the kitchen and has meant that we have taken the decision to close the kitchen until the issue is resolved. I'm extremely grateful to Ms. Hurst who has ensured that we have still been able to offer a sandwich option this week, prepared at South Hunsley.

Next week, we will move to offering several cooked options each day alongside sandwiches, again prepared off site. Please can you ensure that you respond to the email ordering your child's lunches for next week. Whilst we understand that parents value the flexibility we have always offered in ordering each day, pre ordering allows us to forward plan whilst preparing food off site and is intended to be a short term measure until our kitchen returns to action.

During next week, we will be focusing on national Anti-Bullying Week in school. As part of this, we will be talking to the children about strategies to prevent bullying. Within all schools, children fall out on occasions and this is a natural part of growing up and learning about friendships. This should be seen as different to bullying which is 'the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group' (Anti-bullying Alliance). Within our school, we teach our key values of determination, trust, friendship and respect and these values are actively taught and frequently exhibited by our children. Children are given every opportunity to talk to a trusted adult if they are worried about something and a key vehicle in this is the use of learning logs in Class 3 and Class 4 which are available for children to write in at all times.

Within our school, all of our children are unique and this is something we are extremely proud of. As part of Anti-Bullying Week, we will be celebrating our uniqueness by inviting everyone to wear odd socks to school on Tuesday 12th November.

Next Friday, is BBC Children in Need. In order to support this valuable charity, the children are invited to come to school in non-school uniform. In order to raise money for Children in Need, we are requesting a voluntary donation of £1.

Next week we will be learning about the life cycles of mammals.

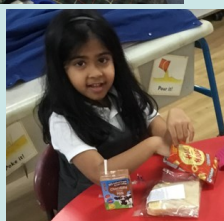

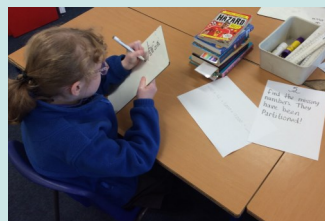
