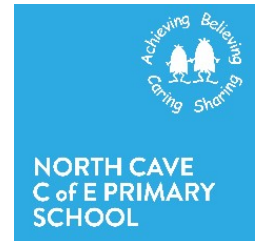

Dear Parents,

Today we reach the end of this half term and the week has ended with our first class worship of this term. The children in Class 4 shared information about their learning in a range of subjects and also shared some of their work. **Class 4** This week we have enjoyed our final cricket session.

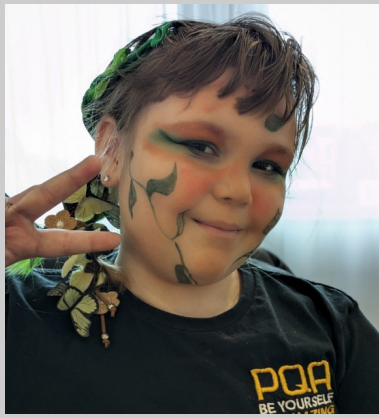
**Next term** We are looking forward to our new topics.
