Dear Parents

This week has seen our Class 4 children take part in a visit to Burton Constable. As part of this visit, they toured the house, looked at some Tudor clothing and tried to identify Tudor items, from cutlery to toys. We look forward to the children in Class 3 taking part in this visit on Monday.

Thank you to all of those that attended our parents' evening on Thursday. At our parents' evening, we were pleased to be able to make the Scholastic Book Fair available for parents to buy from. We get commission from all sales and this is used to buy further books for our children. The book fair will also be available at our parents' evening on Tuesday.

Today, we enjoyed watching our first class worship of this academic year, led by the children in Class 4. Th children shared details of their learning, as well as singing a song about Henry VIII and performing a Tudor dance. Class worships are an important part of our curriculum and we look forward to Class 3's worship next week.

The road outside school is always busy before and after school as the children arrive and leave. We are currently seeing an increase in parents pausing on the yellow zig zags outside in order drop off their children. Please remember that these zig zags exist for the children's safety and we would therefore request that these are observed. Thank you for your support with this.

Within school, we use a number of online learning packages in order to help support the children's learning. These include Reading Plus and Lexia which support the development of both reading and phonics skills. A recent programme we have subscribed to is Times Tables Rock Stars which aims to develop the children's speed and accuracy in their multiplication tables recall. We have trialed this with a group of children who have really enjoyed it. Usernames and passwords will be sent home to the children in Class 3 and Class 4 next week.

Finally, the plastic bottle tops keep arriving and this is great to see. We are pleased that we have now collected 145kg of plastic to be recycled!
