#### Dear Parents

This week we held our open evenings for parents. These were well attended and it was good to be able to celebrate all of the children's achievements so far this year. During the two evenings, we held our Scholastic Book Fair. Thank you to everyone who bought books from this as the school receives commission that will be spent on further books for our children. The book fair will be open straight after school on Monday as a final opportunity for the children and parents to purchase books.

During our open evenings, we asked you to complete our school questionnaire that we complete twice a year. We are grateful for all of the positive feedback and equally grateful for the suggestions of areas in which you would like to see our provision get even better. As we want to canvass as many views as possible, we have today sent home questionnaires to any family that didn't attend parents evening or attended the Year 6 consultations instead. If you wish to complete one of these, please return these by Wednesday 18th October.

Attending school is important and we regularly look at our school attendance data. The government define a child as being persistently absent if their attendance falls below 90%. Children below this threshold will, over a year, have missed almost four weeks of education. Last year, 39% of our children had attendance less than 95% which means that over the year they have missed almost two weeks of learning. Of course, where a child is unwell and unable to attend school, it is right that they remain at home until they are well enough to attend. Please help us to reduce the number of children with low attendance by avoiding term time holidays. We are only able to authorise absence from school for illness or exceptional circumstances. Thank you for your support with this.

As you are aware, the Friends of the School work extremely hard in order to provide additional experiences and funds to support our children. A separate newsletter has been sent to you today which gives you more details about their work. Their first meeting of this academic year takes place at school on Thursday 19th October at 6.30pm. It would be great to see as many people support this meeting as possible.


