Dear Parents

This week has been another positive week in school. It has been great to see the children engaging with their learning so well within the classrooms and enjoying their time together on the playground and field.

On Wednesday, the children in Class 3 enjoyed their visit to Mires Beck Nursery. Whilst there, they experienced planting some small oak trees, digging and compacting soil and learning about how seeds are released from berries. I am grateful to Mires Back for inviting us to visit.

Earlier this week, each class elected their School Councillors. School councillors have an important role in representing the views of their class. This year, we have decided that whilst we will continue to support national fund-raising events, such as Children in Need, we would like to have a focus charity for the year that we can learn more about and fund raise to support. We will be discussing this with our school council, though should you be aware of any causes that you feel the children may wish to support, please discuss these with your child so that these can be fed into the school council's decision making.

Next week, we look forward to welcoming a worker from MIND who will be working in school for half a day a week for this academic year. This is funded through the Trust's 'Be Well' programme and is in addition to the ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) support that we already provide. Throughout the year, our worker will work with classes, smaller groups and individuals both to target identified needs and issues as these arise. She will begin by working with a small group of children to train them as 'Wellbeing Ambassadors' and will also be working with our Year 6 children and exploring the idea of 'resilience'.
