This is done on a 1:1 basis with Miss McDonald and the children take part in a range of activities that test their initial knowledge in English and Maths. There is no formal score reported for this however this allows progress to be measured from the baseline. The children always enjoy taking part in this and see it as a special time with their class teacher.

Yesterday, we were pleased to welcome two visitors to school to talk to the children about plans for redeveloping the play area in North Cave. The children were initially consulted last year and it was great for them to see how their ideas have been taken on board and developed.
