We always look forward to our visits to All Saints Church to take part in four services each year. 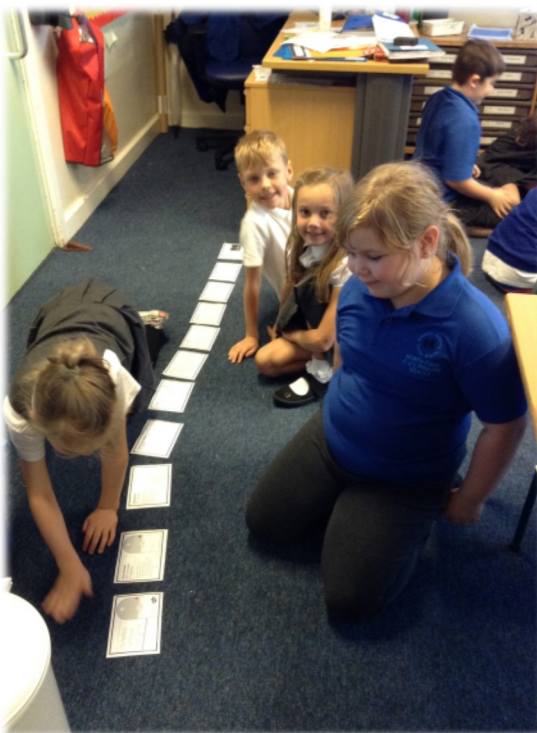
