Dear Parents

This year has seen a significant increase in the number of extra clubs run for our children, both after school and at lunchtime. On Monday, we were pleased to see our extra-curricular offer increased further with our netball club. This is a new club for the school and it has already proved extremely popular. I am grateful to Mrs Deeley for leading this for us.

The summer term is always an extremely busy one for visits and activities. This week, the children in Class 3 should have received their letter for both swimming lessons and their residential visit to Spiers Bank House. We have also finalised the dates for the Class 1 and Class 2 residential visit to Paxwold which will take place between 8th and 9th July for Class 2 and 9th and 10th July for Class 1. Further details about this visit will follow shortly.

Our school lunch menu, agreed with our School Council, has continued this week and the uptake has been really pleasing. This week, the revised meals have included beef chilli and the chicken and stuffing Yorkshire pudding wrap. Whilst we believe our meals provide excellent value for money, we recognise the financial pressures faced by families and would therefore urge any family who believes they may be eligible for free school meals to apply. This is done in confidence and provides your child with a free school meal daily. Though the children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 already receive a free school meal through the Government's Universal Free School Meal initiative, we encourage any family who feels they may be eligible to apply as this also allows the school to access additional pupil premium funding to support our children. During the school day, we encourage the children to drink water. To support with this, we encourage the children to come to school with a refillable water bottle. We have an increasing number of children coming to school without these so please can you encourage your child to remember to bring one from home. We are happy for children to use a bottle that has previously contained another drink, for example a fizzy drink, however would request that where possible, labels are removed prior to bringing this to school. This is to avoid both confusion as to what is in the bottle and also to prevent children from competing over bottle types.
