Dear Parents

This week, a number of our Year 6 children took part in Bikeability, a programme that teaches the children about travelling safely using their bikes. The children have thoroughly enjoyed this and have shown an excellent attitude to their training, listening extremely well.

Online safety is an issue many worry about, with children spending an increasing amount of time online. The internet has allowed us all to communicate more easily, find information quickly and access a range of games that would previously have been unavailable. Within school, the children are given regular reminders about how to stay safe online and our internet access is filtered to ensure that the children are kept as safe as they can be. We also actively promote safety messages during a dedicated e-safety week.
